### "GETTING PARSONAL"

It was perhaps as many as two weeks ago, certainly not more, that I noticed the birds were back. It was during that early morning, pre-dawn time when the sun is just edging towards the horizon and the nighttime darkness is showing the first signs of breaking. Through the winter it's a quiet time. Even on the busy intersection of Pleasant, Charles, Park, and Tremont Streets where the parsonage is located, there's scarce noise that disrupts that most quiet time of the day.

But then, one morning, as I drank coffee and read the morning papers online, from the back of my consciousness, I noticed it: birdsong! I looked up from my screen, staring off into space as I concentrated on the sound. One lone bird was chirping merrily, greeting the oncoming day with great enthusiasm. It's song was joined by another, and then another. I set down my coffee and said a little "thank you," prayer. The sound of the birds made my heart glad. Their songs ushered with them the dawn of spring, too. It's something I've anticipated since about halfway through winter. Perhaps you have, too. And now it is here. Hallelujah!

Easter Morning is another sign of spring my heart anticipates. Those of us who grew up in the church, having spent our lifetimes as active participants in worship's liturgical seasons for decades on end, we know the ways worship matches the seasons of the world around us. And the birds! And their songs!

Easter and springtime lift our hearts. They give a spring to our steps and bring smiles to our lips and even our spirits. Everyone and everything can feel a little more joyful this time of year. I'm so grateful! We've been through a lot, both individually and as a community. The days have not always been easy. In fact, the days aren't necessarily easy for us now. Many of the difficult burdens we've been shouldering still are with us. But now, warm sunshine breaks through a bit, we notice the buds and earliest of flowers and hear the chorus of morning birds. New Life. New Hope. Resurrection! God is with us. It's all good!

If you missed our Easter worship service, or even if you were there on Sunday, it's sure worth watching online. It's still up on the church's Facebook and YouTube pages. When you watch it, you can experience the joy we felt together that glorious morning, with so many people, so many children, so many families, so many musicians, all in our sanctuary, singing praises to God and the Risen Christ. It was such a blessing!

Surely, we all will be walking with a spring in our step for days to come!





Christ is risen! He is truly risen! Alleluia!

By the time you read this, the Easter trumpet will be silenced, the Alleluia's will have dimmed, and the lilies will have begun to wilt a bit....but the season of Easter lasts 50 days until the great feast of Pentecost, this year in May. So we will spend the next 50 days between Easter and Pentecost, singing Easter hymns with lots of Alleluias and rejoicing in the new life that we share in the Risen One!

As a Music Minister, I'm always happy when Easter is in the rear-view mirror, since it's the busiest time of the year for church musicians. Lent, Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Easter Sunday: they all require planning, practice, preparation, and lots of time. I'm so grateful for all our talented musicians with whom I get to work each week: our amazing choir, our new Children's Choir, our handbell choir, guest musicians like the great trumpeter who played on Easter Sunday, and a cellist you'll get to hear on Mother's Day weekend. It's the rare church these days that still has a choir that sings each week, and performs three concerts a year like our choir does: Advent, Palm Sunday, and Music Sunday. I am so grateful for all their hours of dedication, practice at home, rehearsals at church, and time and energy in performance. We are really blessed in their ministry to all of us!

I wanted to let you all know about the work that will be happening this summer on the organ. Much thanks to the efforts of the Organ Restoration Fund, we have the funds needed to releather the Great manual on the organ. The Great manual (the middle of the three keyboards on the organ) is typically the manual that produces the big classic organ sound. However, the leather connections that make the key produce a sound have broken down over time, resulting in lots of notes that don't play. Foley Baker, a really fine organ maker and repair company out of Connecticut, will remove the Great manual at the beginning of May, re-leather it during the summer, and re-install it at the beginning of September. When it returns, we will be able to use the Great manual as it was intended, with no dead notes.

Once the Great has been repaired, then the Swell manual (the top keyboard) and the Pedal board need to be re-leathered to eliminate dead notes in each of those manuals. Your generosity to the Organ Restoration Fund would enable us to do those much needed repairs so as to maintain the legacy of this great historical organ.

### March "Pampered with Luvs" Diaper Drive

In collaboration with the Communities Together Undie Sunday project, First Church members and friends donated diapers, pull-ups and wipes, as well as monetary donations during the Lenten season. These much needed products are very costly for families, and they cannot be purchased with WIC funds or food stamps. Our church collected a total of 3504 diapers and pull-ups, and 4176 wipes. A total of \$155 dollars was collected. Communities Together is a consortium of area churches who work together to address the needs of people in the Merrimack Valley. The donated goods were delivered to a Communities Together site and will be portioned out to various social agencies to be distributed to those who need them. Thank you to everyone who gave generously to this cause!

### **Mental Health Sunday**

We have invited Debi Helms from the Samaritans of Merrimack Valley to speak on the topic of "loneliness" and the effects on mental health. We are excited to have Ms. Helms visit us again. According to the U.S. Surgeon General,

"Our epidemic of loneliness and isolation has been an underappreciated public health crisis. Our relationships are a source of healing and well-being hiding in plain sight – one that can help us live healthier, more fulfilled, and more productive lives."

#### **Pine Ridge Reservation Mission Trip**

The Outreach Team is planning an exciting mission trip to South Dakota the week of September 14-20<sup>th</sup> and any adult is welcome. We have 4 people signed up so far. This trip is to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation where the Lakota and Oglala Tribes live. It is the poorest county in the U.S. and is where our Sewing Group has been sending



handmade clothing for many years. We will be building bunk beds, wheelchair ramps, putting skirting around trailers and building out houses, but this is their "Senior Week" so the workload will be less strenuous. No previous carpentry skills are necessary. The estimated cost will be approximately \$1500-2000 per person. A deposit of \$310 is due by April 7<sup>th</sup> to guarantee a spot. If you are interested in going, but the money is an issue, speak with Carole Silva. The cost will include flights, room & board, and transportation to and from the reservation. ### **Open and Affirming (O&A) Committee**

The Open and Affirming Committee will hold our first education session on **Sunday, April 14**<sup>th</sup>. Reverend Michael Streib, Queer Justice Advocate for the Southern New England Conference, UCC will preach at the service and will be available for conversation after the service. We encourage you to attend this service and meet with Reverend Streib and the ONA Committee members after the service as together we move forward in this journey.

#### Why should my church become ONA?

'All Are Welcome' isn't enough.

LGBTQ+\* people of faith often experience emotional and spiritual injury in churches that condemn their capacity to love and seek love. Because many have learned the hard way that "All Are Welcome" usually doesn't apply to them, LGBTQ+ folks can't assume that every church will be safe for them and their families.

A public welcome by an Open and Affirming (ONA) church sends a clear message to LGBTQ+ seekers that they have a home in the United Church of Christ.

A congregation's affirmation and support through an ONA covenant can be a life-changing and life-saving experience—especially for LGBTQ+ youth and LGBTQ+ seniors.

A public welcome to LGBTQ+ seekers helps churches grow. When ONA congregations attract new members, many of them are LGBTQ+ people and allies who value the congregation's commitment to inclusion and justice.

By adopting an ONA covenant, a congregation is taking seriously St. Paul's admonition to "accept one another, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God." (Romans 15:7, NIV)

\* LGBTQ+ is a shorthand for "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer/questioning." The word "queer" has often been adopted by people who don't want to be constrained by the identities of lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender. The plus symbol reflects the diversity of sexual and gender identities in the human family.


