“GETTING PARSONAL” *Rev. William D. Ingraham*

Even though it became available for me last summer, due to the pandemic, I asked the Board last year to delay the start of my sabbatical to 2022. Additionally, I requested we take it in two equal segments rather than all at one go. Three months seemed like too much time to be away at this moment in history. Last fall and winter I began planning for the first month and a half of sabbatical that begins mid-June. Up until Memorial Day it had seemed a far-off, distant thing. But now, it is only a matter of days away! I will leave Methuen after worship and our ice cream social on Sunday, June 12 and will return to work on Monday, August 1.

Rev. Lauren Buck Medeiros, my friend and colleague from Hawai'i, will serve as our Sabbatical Minister. She preached at First Church about five years ago when she was in New England as part of a delegation of teachers and staff from Punahou School in Honolulu. While some will remember her, I want to give a brief introduction.

Lauren is a third-generation professional minister. She was born in Enid, Oklahoma in a hospital founded by my maternal great uncle. Her father was finishing his theological education at Phillips

University, where he, his wife and her parents all were trained for ministry. Lauren wasn't in Enid for long, however. Just three months after her birth her family was on its way to their first posting as Christian overseas missionaries. She would return to Enid and Phillips University for undergraduate studies, earning the Representative Philippian award as top graduating senior in 1980.

Lauren learned to walk onboard the S.S. Lurline (referred to as "The Queen of the Pacific") as it sailed from California to Hawai'i, where she had to *relearn* how to walk once on land. Her family's destination was Kosrae in the East Caroline Islands. Lauren's first language was Kosraean. Her parents reserved English for when they had something to say they didn't want the girls to understand! Her family also served in Ebeye, Marshall Islands during her youth.

Lauren and I first met at Perkins School of Theology in 1988, though neither of us remembers it. We each sang in the Seminary Singers, performing in worship and concerts. That was her final semester, which was my first. That very spring she received the Homiletics Award (for preaching), one of the highest honors granted by the seminary.

Concurrent with seminary, Lauren served as Director of Music and Youth and Associate Minister and Director of Music at consecutive Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) congregations in Texas. After graduating with a Master of Divinity, she became Associate Minister of Central Union Church UCC in Honolulu, Hawai'i and later, Director of Christian Education at Mililani Presbyterian Church.

Lauren began her career as Chaplain at Punahou School in Honolulu in 1995. Along with her colleagues she helps to resource, create, and lead ten chapel services each week. Punahou chaplains also conduct weddings, funerals, baptisms, and blessings for the expansive and diverse Punahou community. Lauren is also his highly sought-after for pulpit supply and pastoral leadership among the congregations on the Hawaiian island of O'ahu and beyond.

It wasn't until 2012 that Lauren and I became re-acquainted. We were introduced to each other by her father, who by then was a dear friend of mine. Learning that we already had a shared history, Lauren and I bonded in forming a new history of friendship. Though we live half a world apart, we have managed to visit in each other's homes multiple times since my move to Methuen. I am thrilled that she could make herself available to serve here during the first half of my sabbatical. I have no doubt you will quickly grow as fond of her as I am. She has a delightful spirit, is deeply faithful and shares her many gifts for ministry with great joy. You will be in good hands during my time away.

Lauren will arrive in Massachusetts several days before my departure. I will come home several days before her return to Hawai'i. This should afford a seamless transfer of pastoral coverage for First Church throughout the summer.

I often express my gratitude for the blessing of being your pastor. While I am thrilled and eager to begin my sabbatical mid-month, I am also grateful that this place, this church, *our church*, is my home, and the place I'll have the joy and privilege of coming back to.

On May 17 our NIN Food Pantry served 183 families.




Walking Group for Fitness and Fellowship


Prayer Shawl Ministry

Sewing Group



A Trip to Honduras

The Covid Pandemic somewhat abated, I was able to return to Honduras after being there in 2019. While I went to some of the same areas, many were new. I traveled with new people, and a new organization, but basically the same goal. We went to help the Honduran people, in any possible way.

In 2019, the group I joined was from Ohio and consisted of my sister-in-law, Mary, and people from her church, we spent most of our time working in a compound that consisted of an orphanage, a nursing home, a school, and bakery, all run by nuns.

This time I joined a group from Massachusetts called *Olancho Aid*. Olancho is the biggest “state” in Honduras and also the poorest in a poor country. The largest city in Olancho has 125,000 people and if you can believe it, only 1 stop light! Most streets are paved or have cobble stones. Stores are of the small neighborhood mom and pop type. There is a large “department store” that we referred to as Walmart. Because anything possible could be found there.

We came with full suitcases to take things to some of the remote villages. Shoes, toothbrushes, toothpaste, baseball hats, t-shirts, beanie babies, flip flops, matchbox cars, soccer balls, reading glasses, over the counter medications (Tylenol, aspirin, prenatal and children’s vitamins, Motrin). Just to name a few of the things.

Each child at the orphanage received 2 Matchbox cars and 2 Beanie Babies. At the nursing home, we gave the “grandmothers” necklaces and the “grandfathers” a hat and a new t-shirt. It was an exciting day for both groups. They had visitors and gifts! My sister-in-law, Mary, and I felt a special connection with the nursing home and orphanage. Mary had money given to her by her church. We asked the nuns if they had any specific needs, immediately they mentioned fresh fruits and vegetables, cleaning supplies and laundry soap for both places. The kids would love soccer and basket balls. The elders could use Ensure milkshakes and adult diapers. So off we went shopping to buy all of these things! It was great fun.

The Massachusetts group already had their shopping list. Their contact in Honduras routinely hands out bags of groceries each month to different remote villages. Each bag contains:

- Rice: 5 lbs
- flour 2 lbs
- corn flour: 2 lbs
- butter for cooking: 1 kilo
- sugar: 4 lbs
- spaghetti 1 lb
- spaghetti sauce: 2 jars
- coffee: 1 kilo
- T-paper: 2 rolls
- salt: 1 lb
- Matches

Mary and I were able to deliver all our store bought items the next day.

Olancho Aid, the Massachusetts group had to sort their food stuffs into 50 bags for 50 families. It filled a pick-up truck. Two days later we all went out to the countryside to deliver all of our goods. Dirt roads, lots of dust, cows, and chickens, we arrived at the village school.

The school was a one room cement building with electricity and an open space near the roof to act as ventilation. No fans, no bathroom. This is where families came to receive their bag of groceries. Also, whatever else we had brought with us. Every child got a pair of shoes, sandals, or flip flops. Some got toothbrushes and toothpaste. Just about everyone received something beside the bag of groceries.

Lynn, a member of our group, had been sponsoring a boy from this village for some time. He knew she was coming and was very excited. What he didn't know was that Lynn was delivering a bicycle that she had bought for him. He was absolutely over the moon excited! Because of her sponsorship he was able to go to school in the capitol. To do this, he and his mother started early in the morning riding her motorcycle to her job. From there he would take the bus another 3 hours into the capitol to go to school. Such commitment to education.

People wonder why I go to Honduras, to a third world country. A place that could be violent and could make me sick. I don't go to be glorified. I go for the joy I see in people's faces. I go to be humbled when I have so much. I go to be reminded that when we "feed" the people, we are feeding Him.

If we have learned anything from this pandemic, it's to value our lives and those we love. Our health and safety are high priority. Slow down and take the time to live in the moment. Take a deep breath and know that we need to stop over scheduling ourselves and enjoy the simple things in life, like life itself.

Pick a childhood memory and rekindle that yourself or with your own family. We all deserve that.




