

Minister's Message Rev. Dr. Ann Rogers-Brigham

Dear Members and Friends,

November, for me, is a time to be invited to pause and give thanks for the gift of life, especially everyday blessings. It is a time to be ready for new spiritual growth and development. At First Church, we have blessings each week to celebrate and opportunities for faith development in weeks ahead.

What are these opportunities? Our traditional Stewardship season at First Church begins with the theme "Living the Vision Together," we will host a Community Thanksgiving worship with other Methuen churches on November 23rd and, very important, our food distribution to the wider community

will be held on Tuesday, November 25th. At the end of the month, we go into the *First Sunday of Advent* and prepare our hearts for the coming of the Promised One as we light the first candle of "hope."

All of what we do in worship and in our gatherings as a church is around our desire to be faithful to our covenant to be friends in Christ and friends to all who need us and count on us. How can we best do this as a community and as individuals?

One way is to be consistent and faithful on the journey of faith development. We can do this in different ways. Sometimes, our faith grows in unplanned spontaneous ways. Other times, it is helpful to do some intentional planning for our personal faith development.

I have found, through the years, that both are needed: spontaneity and intentionality. In this message, please allow me to encourage one intentional practice of study and reflection that gives the benefit of spiritual growth. It may already be part of your daily practice but, if not, you may want to give it a try. It is the practice of "Lectio Divina."

What is Lectio Divina? Lectio Divina is Latin for "divine reading," "spiritual reading," or "holy reading." Lectio Divina, is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. The intention of this traditional monastic practice is to promote communion with God and provide special spiritual insight. It also helps one to be ready for sensing, thinking, feeling, and intuiting the world we live in. It is especially helpful as we commit to serve others with love and compassion through our church and its ministries.

So, find a time for quiet relaxation, making yourself comfortable and try to clear your mind of distractions. Sometimes it is helpful to take deep, cleansing breaths and repeat a chosen phrase or word several times to help free the mind. Then, follow four steps:

- Lectio. Read a Bible passage slowly a few times. Savor and ruminate on each portion of the reading, constantly listening for the "still, small voice" of a word or phrase that speaks to you.
- *Meditatio*. Reflect on the passage and consider how it applies to your life. Pay special attention to the feelings that arise and how God speaks.
- Oratio. Respond to the passage by praying and opening your heart to God. This is the beginning of your conversation with God. You may keep a journal to record your thoughts if that is helpful.
- Contemplatio. Contemplate all that you learned. Sit in silence, rest in God's presence, and experience union with Christ.

I was introduced to the practice of Lectio Divina on different occasions in my theological studies. But, soon after my husband, Bill, died, I was on a retreat in Avila, Spain, when I really learned about the benefit of the practice for my "grieving" life. I read scripture and I read poetry in a different way. I felt the presence of God giving me comfort and helping me find strength more deeply as I allowed the practice to be part of my daily life.

November is sometimes a month for grieving, isn't it? We may look around and remember those who are no longer with us during the holidays or with us as they once were, sitting next to us in church, at the dinner table or on a simple car ride. Maybe this method of study will help you, whatever your need. May we cherish intentional study and those spontaneous, unexpected experiences that help us grow in faith. May we always find ways, windows, openings to know God's goodness, God's comfort, God's grace on our spiritual journey of growth and faith development.

This interim time in the life of First Church is filled with possibilities for deep spiritual potential, isn't it? As we covenant to be in relationship to God and to one another, may we take seriously the invitation to take stock of our life as a church and dream about who we might become and how we might grow in the remainder of this year and the year ahead. Prayers for our Search Team and the candidates who may read our profile and discern a call to First Church! Truly, may we "live our vision together!"

The reason – and feel free to call me crazy – is that I really try to get all of my Christmas chores complete before the first Sunday of Advent (which is Nov. 30th this year). I know... I know... that's madness! However, I challenge you to try it. You will be amazed how much more the season will mean to you, and there will be a spiritual connection that is very rewarding. Even if you only get half of your projects done, you will be blessedly surprised how good it will feel. So give it a try and let me know what you think. In First Church, I know that many of our church committees are working on these special elements, events, and programs as well, so it will be a wonderful season ahead!

 was a large endeavor to upgrade our ailing equipment, so I thank you for your patience as we

- Our Outreach group is hard at work with numerous efforts. The book drive was a huge success, providing more than 400 volumes to grateful children! Interested in Church Membership?




Confirmation Class Meetings

Musical Musings

It's been an interesting fall: a bunch of work travel for me (more than usual), and choir absences and away weekends for them, too! And through it all, the choir makes beautiful music, week after week... I'm so proud of their efforts and results. We are VERY fortunate to have this caliber choir every week at church!

November is busy, too! Plans for Advent, then the Advent Cantata, then Christmas....lots of music to teach and learn... it's a busy time! I've heard from some of you that you wish we did more Christmas music during Advent. So let me explain: the Church provides us with an Advent season of 4 Sundays to prepare for Christmas: to wait, like Mary, for the birth of her Son. Then the Church gives us a Christmas season: from Christmas Eve until we celebrate the baptism of Jesus: 12 days of Christmas, to rejoice in his birth. This year, the 4 Sundays of Advent are Nov 30, Dec 7, Dec 14, and Dec 21. Our Advent Cantata is scheduled for Sunday, Dec 14 during which we will feature some gorgeous new and old music of the season, and on Dec 21st, we will begin using some Christmas carols as we wait for the birth of Christ in our world today!


It's Festival of Trees time! Last year, we all pitched in together, and built a beautiful tree with a musical theme that won 1st Place in the Traditional Tree category. The beautiful glass tree prize is on the mantle in the parlor for you to admire!

So this year, our theme is *The Twelve Days of Christmas: A Partridge in a Pear Tree*. The twelve days of Christmas are the time between Christmas and Epiphany, Jan 6, and most sources today say that the song was originally a children's memory song. For our tree this year, we wanted to incorporate a few fun elements, including a "where's the partridge" contest with a wrapped gift under the tree to the person who wins the tree and finds the hidden partridge. We will be needing 12 drums or drummers, 11 flutes or pipers piping, 10 lords or jumping, 9 dancing ladies, 8 maids milking or milk cans, 7 swans swimming, 6 geese laying, 5 golden rings, 4 calling birds, 3 French hens, and 2 turtle doves, for a total of 77 different ornaments. Additionally, Rich and I have already bought the partridge, and will also be purchasing pears for the tree, along with ribbon and fillers (and the tree, of course!). So how can you help? Two ways: first, if you'd like to support the effort, you can write a check to the church and put *Festival of Trees* in the memo line. The money will be directed to the fund to support this event. OR, in a week or so, we will be putting up a big poster with a way for folks to sign up to purchase some of those 77 ornaments, so that we don't end up with duplicates or extras. Look for it at the crossroads in the next week or so! And watch the bulletin for more announcements. Rich and I are really excited to see what we can put together again as a church family!

"Jesus didn't turn people away, neither do we." When you're gutsy enough to make such a claim, it's not always easy to make good on it. Following Jesus' lead, the United Church of Christ strives to keep doors open to all. By God's grace—in the past and today—we do what needs to be done to be bold people of God's welcome.

Jesus lived and breathed gracious hospitality. Even though there were powerful people who opposed Jesus' extravagant welcome, he still embraced those who were often shunned. In the reign of God that Jesus spoke of, he declared there is room for all—children (Luke 18:15-17) and those who are hungry, thirsty, homeless, ill, poor, grieving, persecuted, and in prison (Matthew 25: 31-46 and Luke 6:20-26). Jesus put faith and hospitality together: "Whoever receives one whom I send receives me" and those who received Jesus, embraced God (John 13:20).

This kind of hospitality is characteristic of both God's faithfulness and, at our best, our faithfulness. God welcomes, and also feeds the hungry, forgives sins, stands with those who are poor and oppressed, comforts the suffering, and becomes home for those who wander. In gratitude, faithful people welcome strangers. A surprise in the Bible is the way you welcome a stranger expresses how you embrace the very presence of God (Genesis 18:1-8 and Luke 23:28-35).

The church, since its beginning, continues to "extend hospitality to strangers (Roman 12:13)." The church, after all, is a blessed company of strangers held together by the grace of God.

UCC churches express God's extravagant welcome in a variety of ways. Our welcome embraces both those we invite to participate in our congregations, as well as those outside the church, with whom we work for God's justice and compassion. That is our prayer, our hope.

Who is welcome? Our churches are among those whose doors are open to God's children of different cultures, races, genders, ages, sexual orientations, abilities, economic situations, and theological traditions. It isn't always easy to be so open. Each UCC congregation prayerfully discerns and expresses how wide their doors and arms are open. Some state it this way, "We are a multicultural and multiracial, open and affirming and just peace church."

Once one enters the door, it's not a matter of "sit back, be quiet, speak only as we do." You, your heart's questions and your gifts, are vital to the congregation. Both we and you grow together in faith and witness. Your distinct story of faith joins with centuries of stories that make up the Church, and specifically the United Church of Christ. In God's grace, you change: we change. We make a holy difference in each other's lives, and, together, in the world.

In gratitude, because God welcomes us, we are called to make bold stands. In behalf of and along with those who remain oppressed, suffering, alienated, and poor in God's world, we speak and act . "It's not an extravagant welcome to an 'anything-goes' religion, a comfortable form of Christianity,

but to a costly form of discipleship," says John Thomas, current president and general minister of the UCC. Thomas calls this kind of discipleship "evangelical courage." It's the other side of the "extravagant welcome" coin. You see this risky faith expressed throughout our history that at times has been hidden. Inspired by God's gift of hospitality, we work for God's welcoming world of love and justice.
