

### "GETTING PARSONAL"

Rev. William D. Ingraham

There's no place like home! My travels abroad ended mid-August, drawing to a close our first sabbatical together, taken in two halves over back-to-back summers. After so much time away, I was eager to get back to work with our church and community. Within two hours of arriving home, I was attending the first of two meetings that night – the Open and Affirming Committee and the Outreach Ministry Team. Jet lagged as I was, it was exciting to learn where each of them is in their work and to join in making plans for the coming year. My first morning in the office was spent doing worship planning and calling to catch up with people with ongoing pastoral care needs. Those early hours and days back were grounding for me, settling me back into the rhythm of life and ministry at First Church Congregational. What a blessing!

I'm grateful for Pastor Lauren's ministry, not only this year but last summer, too. Since the pandemic, pastors, especially interim and sabbatical ministers, have been in short supply across the

whole Christian church. I know of several congregations that have had to handle these transitions on their own, without clergy support. But not us! Lauren was willing to give us her precious summers two years in a row. How I admire her! She's a highly skilled pastor with outstanding gifts for preaching and worship leadership, let alone her skill in pastoral care. I've had the bonus of extra time with her upon my return. It not only afforded us a smooth pastoral transition, but also gives us time as friends to savor our moment together before she returns home to Hawaii.

We're swiftly moving into one of the busiest times of our year. Welcome Sunday is set for September 17, with details in a blue box just a little further into this newsletter. The choir soon will return from summer break under the gifted ministry of Mike Boutin. Sunday school will start up again and soon, and I'll be announcing this year's Confirmation class schedule before September's end. Add to this a full schedule of outreach projects, special programs, and activities, and before you know it, we'll be encroaching on Advent! It's going to be a remarkable fall, and a fantastic program year. I'm looking forward to it!

In closing, I'll share these pictures of an ancient church I visited while in Norway. Built in a remote Norwegian mountain town in the early 1300s, this building housed a congregation's worship for more than five centuries before the community decided to replace it with a more modern structure. That was in the mid-1850s. As dark as it is inside, I can hardly blame them. Still, I'm glad it was moved, reassembled, and preserved for posterity's sake. This building is referred to as a stave church due to the tall poles, or staves, that support its structure. It's 100% wood and tar, no nails or metal hinges. Though it's been decommissioned from worship for nearly two centuries, it still felt like holy ground to me. I offered prayers there for our church and community, my friends, family and the world. It was perhaps the most moving religious space I visited all summer, and that's saying a lot.

I gotta say again, it's good to be home! I look forward to seeing more of you as our program year moves into full swing. No doubt, God has many blessings in store for us as we live into our calling in the months and years ahead.

Thanks, finally, to Pastor Lauren, for creating the space to make music fun and interesting throughout the summer, especially with her ukulele!

I'm eager to get back to work at FCM, and in fact, have already been at work planning music for the fall, Advent, and Christmas seasons. The choir will formally resume on Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup> and we are eager and ready to spend another year learning, growing, praying, and having fun together. We always welcome new singers: for a week, for a month, or for as long or as often as your life allows. No previous experience is necessary, though it certainly helps to be able to read music. My biggest goal for this year is to organize the music library. Currently we have hundreds of choir music sheets that we have no way of knowing anything about except to literally hunt and peck through the files. I'd like to create a searchable digital file of all our music that would list title, author, # of copies, voice parts, season, and instrumentation so that we could more easily use what we have without having to spend money on new music. The project requires at least10 people with laptops connected to the church wi-fi each of whom takes 50 pieces of music, numbers them, and enters the information into a Google database. Within a few hours, 500 pieces of music have been numbered and cataloged and are now searchable! Anyone with basic computer skills can do this. My plan is to take a Saturday morning/afternoon in the fall to get it done. Stay tuned for more details....

### **Open and Affirming (O&A) Committee**

"Welcome, we are so glad you are here!" These words of welcome and the accompanying atmosphere of support, understanding, and love are what we all long for as we enter our churches. Open and Affirming is an official designation of congregations in the United Church of Christ (UCC) affirming the full inclusion of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and non-binary persons in the church's life and ministry. An Open and Affirming covenant (ONA) is more than a statement, policy, declaration, or amendment to a congregation's by-laws. A covenant is an act of faith, a solemn promise to God in response to God's holy Word.

The Open and Affirming Coalition certifies local churches and other ministries of the UCC as "Open and Affirming" after adoption of an ONA covenant welcoming all persons into Christian community, including equal participation in the life and ministries of the church. This welcoming process is well-thought out and planned and involves many steps, as follows:

Step 1 – *Leading the Journey* 

Step 2 – Gathering Information

Step 3 - Building Relationships

Step 4 – Mapping the Journey

Step 5 - Community Recognition of the Journey

Step 6 – Providing Educational Opportunities

Step 7 – Writing Your Welcoming Statement

Step 8 – Conducting an Exploratory Survey

Step 9 - Holding the Votes

Step 10 - Celebrating and Publicizing

Step 11 – We're Welcoming... Now What?

The O&A committee is currently at Steps 3 and 4. We have had discussions with many church members and are reflecting on what we have learned and discerning how to move forward. Over the course of the next several months we will provide informational sessions, printed resources, and other educational sessions to provide everyone with an opportunity to learn and ask questions. We encourage you to read the material we distribute, take part in the discussions, and talk to a committee member as we go through this journey together.

### Back to School Program - Mall Day

Then they went to a table to pick up their backpack which was filled with age appropriate school supplies, then to the table where they picked up a bag with a new outfit for school, and then to a table where they picked up a box with new sneakers.

Last, but not least, they went to the table manned by "The Masons" where they got a bag of healthy snacks. A number of children played in the playground next to the park until 10:30 AM when the Ice Cream Truck came, donated by Mayor Perry, and then they made a "bee line" for the truck. Bada Bing provided lunch for all the volunteers. ### **Clothing Drive for Youth**

Time to clean out your closets of "gently used" clothes for ages 2T through Grade 8 (men's/women's small/medium) to help restock Methuen YMCA's "Kids Closet." **There is a special need for fall and winter clothes for teens**, although the YMCA will take clothing for any season. See the flyer is this issue of the Beacon.

The clothing drive runs from Sunday, August 27 to Sunday, October 1. Clothes can be dropped off on each of the Sundays during the above time period from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM prior to church, but not during church hours, of 10:00 to 11:00 AM, and after church from 11:00 AM until 12:00 PM (Noon). This means clothes can only be dropped off on Sundays at those times, or on the one Saturday, September 23, from 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM. Chapel School is in session during the week, and they are not able to receive clothes while school is in session and there is no one at the church after those hours to receive the clothes.

### "Let's Book It" - Book Drive for Comprehensive Grammar School

Last fall we held a Book Drive for Grades K-6<sup>th</sup>, for the Tenney Grammar School. You enabled us to collect over 700 new and gently used books for which the school was very grateful and put into immediate use. 


