Interim Minister Message Rev. Dr. Ann Rogers-Brigham

Dear members and friends,

October days bring us autumn delights! May I share with you a call to worship written by a colleague/friend in ministry, Rev. Maren Tirabassi, that brings me spiritual delight?

"God be praised for turning seasons—blustery winter with its snow-face, the fragile wings of spring, and hot, heavy, growing, grazing summer. Now two-faced autumn begins with burnished days and drizzling days. Autumn—September crimson, October orange and cat-black, November gray.

Autumn—golden leaves, ripe red Cortlands, school bells, football cheers, pumpkin pie, cider, mince, the smell of cold and smoke, the touch of homecoming.

Autumn—when between the boughs of leaf-lost trees squirrels race winter.

We gather in the harvest of our lives, the plenty, the old, and rake up the scatterings—dried hopes and fallen dreams.

Maren, a UCC minister, poet, spiritual retreat leader, knows how to capture the internal feelings around the turning of seasons with words to describe our days here in New England. She was from the mid-west and I had come from Kentucky to Boston, so we shared common backgrounds.

Maren's family and my family became friends; Maren's son and my son went to church camp together and we shared family picnics. She rejoiced with me when my daughter, Martha, was born and gave me support and care. Oh, how the years have passed, but I think about the years we shared when our children were young and the enjoyment of life together in the church.

Maren taught me, in many ways, about praising God for turning seasons. As I hear you talk about life here at First Church, I hear similar stories about lives woven together through the years. I hear you praising God for the bounty of friendship and the gift of support when times were difficult. The themes of joy, change, loss and transition emerge in the stories. It doesn't matter if First Church has been your spiritual family for many years or for a few short weeks/months. What matters is that we, as a body of believers, create community by caring for one another in the changing seasons of our lives, here and now and going forward.

You welcomed me to be your interim pastor a year ago and I reflect on that welcome with gratitude. You welcome new families and individuals to First Church weekly. We love our stories of the past and we love what is to come! Yes, the search process for a new settled minister invites our leaning into the future with great expectation and gathering the harvest of our church life stories to offer God thanksgiving.

I'm glad to be with you as we go into autumn days here at First Church. We look forward to our weekly worship gatherings and opportunities for fellowship and outreach. Let's continue to keep our Search Committee in our prayers as they do their work. Let's serve together, pray together, and be grateful for what we have and what is to come. Let's have open hearts and minds to the movement of the Spirit!

Blessing of the Animals Saturday, October 4th, at 10:00 AM

It is that time of year when we gather for a *Blessing of the Animals* service. Mike Boutin and Rev. Ann will lead the service with assistance from our congregation. We will sing, pray and bless!

Why do we have a blessing for our pets on Saint Francis Day? Saint Francis of Assisi is known as the patron saint of animals, and his commemoration takes place on October 4^{th} . He lived long ago yet his message is still among us! He was born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone (c. 1181 – 3 October 1226) but is known as Francis of Assisi OFM (Order of Friars Minor), an Italian mystic and Catholic friar who founded the Franciscans.

On this day, it is good to remember that our blessing is for all animals, not just those who are our pets. St Francis patronage is based on the lore of his preaching the gospel to wild animals. If we keep to the spirit of Saint Francis, then our blessing will encompass pets, work and farm animals, and animals in the wild. Come with prayers for all!

Celebrating World Communion Sunday October 5th

Most of us have heard about World Communion Sunday but may not know much about where the celebration originated. According to the website of the National Council of Churches, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches (predecessor of the NCC) in 1940. Since then, the celebration has grown into an international ecumenical celebration of Christian unity. The key word for World Communion Sunday is communion, or unity.

We celebrate World Communion Sunday with congregations all over the globe. Followers of Jesus Christ in large churches and small, on farms and in cities, in ornate buildings and under tents, gather to receive the bread and cup of Holy Communion. Some will receive cubes of bread. Some will tear from a common loaf. Some will receive a wafer. Some will drink from a common chalice. Some will dip a piece of bread into the cup. Some will have individual glasses. Some will use wine; some juice. Some will offer both.

Pastors will lead a variety of liturgies, in many languages. Clergy will dress traditionally, formally, and casually. Despite the differences in our denominations and traditions, we celebrate our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Come and join us, join the "world," as we celebrate our unity among Christians through the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

As always, we have plenty more going on, including:





By the time you read this, choir will have resumed. I am so grateful for all those folks who dedicate so much of their time on Sunday mornings and during the week as they practice on their own for Sunday. We have a remarkably dedicated group of really talented singers and I know how much you all value the ministry they share. Don't forget to take a moment on Sunday to thank our choir members personally!

Due to those who helped to complete the digital music library project last year, this year, I've been able to program music from our library, and that means an even greater diversity of musical styles and sounds. I'm excited to share some of the great and classical music that the choir will be working on over the coming weeks and months. Make sure to tell us what you really like....or don't!

Each week, I work and pray hard to choose hymns and responses based on the readings from the revised common lectionary that Ann selects, the seasons of the church year like Advent or Lent, whatever current event might be going on and catching our attention, and whatever theme or special guest we might be having. I use a number of different resources, including the hymnal's own appendices, an online resource called Singing from the Lectionary, and a website called Hymnary. Sometimes, I even ask ChatGPT! You'd be surprised how many creative ways there are to plan worship these days! I always welcome your feedback; hymns you really like to sing, hymns you wish we never sang again, and hymns you wish we would sing again....email me or stop me after church!

Finally, looking ahead: we are planning an interfaith Thanksgiving service on Sunday, November 23rd, at 2:00 PM, hosted by us here at First Church. Various local clergy will lead the service, and local choirs will perform their own selections and will join together to sing the congregational hymns and a joint choir performance of Vaughn Williams' Old Hundredth with the congregation. It's going to be a great event, and since we are hosting it, it would be GREAT to have many of you there, so mark your calendars, please!
