

Musical Musings

Happy New Year....my wish for you all is a year filled with joy and peace, music in your hearts, and when the trials come, faith in a God who walks with us, especially in the dark valleys.

I'm writing this the day after our amazing Advent Cantata, so today, my thoughts are all about our choir and musicians. I wonder if you appreciate how blessed we are at First Church to have a choir at worship each week with at least 12 singers? Many churches today have had to abandon their choir programs for lack of committed singers on a weekly basis: many churches with which I am familiar have a choir once a month, or a few times a year, and if they have a weekly choir, it's often 3-4 singers, many of whom, suffice it to say, lead people to pray: "Dear God, make this end, soon!"

Yet, here at First Church, each week, we have a choir of at least 12 people, many of whom have sight reading skills, are vocally trained, or sing in other musical ensembles and choirs. For events like the Cantata, we attract singers who don't regularly sing with us, but who welcome the opportunity to sing with us for special events. Your choir works REALLY HARD: hours of rehearsals at church on Sunday mornings, and at home. For each of our choir anthems, I create rehearsal recordings that allow the choir members to learn their parts on their own at home, to sing along with me, to sing along with the other parts, or to just sing along with the accompaniment. They tell me they spend hours practicing with those recordings: and, yesterday's Cantata is a real testament to that hard work. Handbells, recorders, flutes, congas, claves, shakers, soloists, mom and daughter duets, and even a small schola group doing really serious 16th century polyphony. Amazing!

I am honored to collaborate with this choir....and humbled to be their leader.

Only one thing would make it better: more people in the pews to appreciate how good they really are. Yesterday, it seemed to me that we had nearly as many people in the choirs as we did in church! You see, listening on Facebook or YouTube is just not the same. The quality of the sound isn't the same, the resonance in the room isn't the same, and certainly the experience of listening to music and worshiping together in person isn't the same. If you love the choir and the music that we perform, please, come back and listen in person!

Souper Bowl of Caring 2024

NIN Christmas Food Pantry

The Christmas Neighbors in Need Food Pantry took place at First Church on Tuesday, December 19th. Fuller than usual bags of groceries were packed and handed out to close to 400 families. There will not be a food pantry held between Christmas and New Year's, as per usual. Bag contents included peanut butter, a roast beef, canned vegetables, canned or frozen fruit, canned beans, rice, oatmeal packets, bagged fresh sweet potatoes and onions, or regular potatoes, fresh bagged apples, a cake mix and frosting or brownies, and Lindor truffles. Funds left over from our generous Thanksgiving donations allowed us to buy rice, cake mixes, frosting and brownies to supplement our food coming from Neighbors in Need, so that we would have enough for 400 families. Thanks to all our volunteers on both A and B Teams who selflessly donate their time throughout the year!

Gifts to the Manger and Adopt a Child

Thanks to everyone who donated Christmas gifts for the children at Methuen Area Neighborhood (MAN), Inc. as part of our *Gifts to the Manger* program. Parents were able to choose gifts from our donations, and wrap them with donated Christmas wrapping paper, bows and tape. Thanks also to all who participated in *Adopt-a-Child*, buying gifts for specific children from provided wish lists. All the gifts were delivered to MAN Inc. by Lori Bennett.

We will continue to honor Ray's memory through our donations of soup and money in 2024. Many of us remember his dedication to and enthusiasm for this outreach project which helps to feed the food insecure in the Merrimack Valley.

For 2024, we have set our Souper Bowl goals at 1500 cans of soup and \$1500 in monetary donations. All cans of soup and monetary donations raised will go to the Neighbors in Need Food Pantry, including the one held here at First Church each Tuesday evening.

We will be kicking off the Souper Bowl on Sunday, January 14th with an announcement and introduction to our "score board" which will track our progress. We will celebrate the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarters on the following Sundays: January 21st and 28th, and February 4th and 11th. We will hold a half-time celebration on January 28th with lots of "tailgate snacks", and possibly a repeat corn hole competition, during coffee hour. Don't forget to wear your game jerseys!

Cans of soup and monetary donations can be brought to church each Sunday before and after church until 12:00 noon, from January ^{14th} to February 11th. Each Sunday, from January 21st to February 11th, during announcements, we will report on the number of cans received, enabling us to more down the "field" toward our goals. What's the REACH Ministry?




